Letter from the President April 07

To All Ayrshire Breeders and Friends.

Hopefully this newsletter has reached you after some long awaited good rains. Right throughout Australia I know you have all been doing it tough these past few years and I congratulate those of you who have continued to dairy farm, especially with our wonderful breed, farming in some of the harshest conditions on record. Hopefully there will finally be some light at the end of the tunnel with some good winter rainfall and better prices for our milk.

Firstly I must inform you that at the last Federal Council Meeting in March, John Eagles stood down as President of Ayrshire Australia, after 9 years at the helm. I must thank John for the wonderful job that he has done during that time and he will continue on Federal Council as the NSW representative and as Federal Treasurer. John didn't have an easy task during his time as president, having to cope with the biggest decline in registrations and memberships in our organizations history. With such an exodus of dairy farmers leaving the industry throughout Australia, it is regrettable that there are also many Ayrshire farms that have sold out, this making it increasingly hard for Ayrshire Australia to function profitably. Under John's guidance we have managed to almost stay in the black but the future will be even harder. For the continued success of the Ayrshire breed I must encourage you all to continue to be members and register your animals. Our breed is still definitely an economical alternative to the black and white.

As your new president I hope that I can do the breed justice. I will always strive to continue the success of my predecessors and will always put our wonderful breed first. If anyone has any problems or wish to discuss anything please feel free to make contact anytime. For those of you who do not know me I have been a member since I was given a calf in 1970. I was first a South Australia representative on the old Federal Council in 1984 and was an original member of the first 5 person Federal Board ("the frisky five") when it was created in 1994. I

love the Ayrshire breed and enjoy meeting with all Ayrshire breeders, friends and followers at shows, sales and conferences.

Ayrshire Journal

Unfortunately we were unable to print a Journal in 2006. In recent years we have had some excellent publications done by Vivian Hicks our editor but she was unable to continue on the journal. We must thank her for all the effort she had put in on publishing the previous journals and as we have discovered, it hasn't been an easy task to find a new editor. Classifications

Holstein Australia has recently announced that our Ayrshire classifications will be done on computer with new up to date software. The classifier will score the animals on a handheld which communicates wirelessly to a laptop. The laptop in turn communicates wirelessly back to the Head Office. Our breed members will now be charged the same fee structure as Holstein breeders at \$11.00 per animal plus a herd visit fee of \$55.00 GST inclusive. Lloyd Bergmann the chairman of our classification committee has been in contact with Holstein Australia and his committee will meet to ensure that the weights and ideals for each individual trait are what we require for our breed here in Australia. These can be updated at regular intervals.

World Conference

The 11th World Ayrshire Conference is to be held on 2nd to 12th June 2008 in Finland. Having been to 3 of these events I can recommend them to anyone who may be thinking of going. The friendships that are gained with Ayrshire breeders from throughout the world are wonderful. I know that in the current dairy climate things are very tough here in Australia but we all must remember that we are all only here once, so we should all take opportunities when they arise. I can guarantee that you will return with an enriched enthusiasm towards dairying and our wonderful Ayrshire cow. Camden Show

This years Camden Show was again keenly contested by a number of exhibitors, traveling from as far away as Gooloogong in the Central West and up from the South Coast as well as local exhibitors from Camden & Glenfield.

In what is generally thought of as a guide to the competition at Sydney Royal, the ***Hayter Family's*** Aged Cow – ***Werombi Trident Grace*** was named **Champion Ayrshire Cow**. The **Reserve Champion Cow** and this years' **Best Uddered Cow** was ***Paschendaele Janine 3rd*** of the ***Eagles Partnership*** stable. ***Eagles Partnership*** claimed the **Pen of 3 Cows** award for the 5th consecutive year winning the Rex Hayter Memorial Prize. ***Vicki Smart*** was victorious in winning both **Junior Champion Heifer** and **Reserve Heifer** with ***Regal Park Vicki's Surprise*** and ***Regal Park Solena*** respectively.

In a lovely tribute Eric and Sylvia Eagles were awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award for their involvement, contribution and participation with the Camden Show Society over a period of 51 consecutive years, having never missed exhibiting cattle in that time. They were presented their award by the Federal Member for Macarthur, The Honourable Pat Farmer.
