### **Ayrshire Forum**

On June 19<sup>th</sup> the Federal Council held an Ayrshire Forum in Melbourne. This was the first time in 5 years that the Federal Council has met in a "Face to Face" meeting. Along with the council members there were invited Ayrshire members from each state to participate in the Forum to discuss and plan the future of Ayrshire Australia and set a "Mission Statement" for our breed.

I would like to personally thank the participants who gave up their time to travel to Melbourne for the meeting. Members attending the Forum were:- Ray Zerner, Sue Jones (QLD) John Eagles, David Mayo, Vicki Smart (NSW) Lloyd Burgmann, Mike Perry (VIC) Kevin Morgan, Matthew Luck (TAS) Greg Edmonds, Mike Hentschke, Leonie Duncan (SA).

David Mayo and Michael Hentschke were the main speakers for the day covering many subjects including breed promotion, progeny testing, classification, breed sales, A.I. & commercial options with the theme of the day being Today, Tomorrow and The Future. Forum members took part in short workshops covering subjects such as positives & advantages of the Ayrshire Cow and ways of promotion of our Ayrshire Cow. The Forum was a full day of speakers and discussion finishing up with a Federal Council meeting.

There were many suggestions and positives that came out of the Forum. One such suggestion was for us to try and once again hold an Ayrshire Conference at regular intervals at different locations throughout Australia. The conference needs only to be over two days but a gathering of member's increases enthusiasm and communication and allows for face-to-face council meetings. If any state branch or club feels that they may be able to hold a conference please let your federal council member know.

Probably the major concern of the Forum for the future of our breed was the problem of having two Ayrshire organizations within Australia. To try and address this I have written to the Committee of the AABA to see if they are willing to meet with myself and our Vice President Lloyd Burgmann to discuss our two groups getting back together to form one Australian Ayrshire organization. Hopefully they will be discussing the letter at their next meeting and we await their reply.

### **CLASSIFICATION INFORMATION**

#### **Hi Ayrshire Members,**

Michael Hentschke, Michael Perry and myself recently met with Chief Executive Officer of HFAA, regarding the new classification system and software. This software has been developed and tested in Canada on well over 250,000 animals and is now used to classify all dairy cows in that country.

The software allows the classifier to score 22 linear traits, 7 of which are actual measurements. The software takes into consideration the stage of lactation, the age of the animal and the fullness of the udder to calculate the four composites and the final score. With its focus on linears, the software should encourage consistency and make the management of the classification program much easier. The 22 traits are summarised into 4 composites, which define the main functional parts of a cow:

**Composites 1: Mammary System**

**2: Feet and Legs**

**3: Dairy Strength**

**4: Rump**

The software runs on handhelds, which can commute wirelessly to the classifiers laptop. The laptop in turn communicates wirelessly back to Head Office, from anywhere there is a mobile phone signal. This functionality allows for more updated information during classification and for classification information to be sent to Head Office each day. The classifier is able to search for an animal using the herd book number, name, NLIS, or other identifier, making the owner's job much easier.

The Classification Committee has the ability to set weights and ideals for each individual trait, in order to encourage the type of Ayrshire cow we feel is needed in Australia.

In terms of fee structure HFAA are offering the same rate as to their own members, at \$11.00 per animal, plus a herd visit fee of \$55.00, both of these prices are inclusive of GST.

Finally I would like to thank Michael Hentschke, David Mayo and Michael Perry for their input into the program.

**Eulogy - Geoffrey Charles Mayo, 13th November 1934 – 4th June 2007  
by David Mayo**



Geoffrey Charles Mayo was born on the 13<sup>th</sup> of November 1934, at Kiama private hospital. His parents Edward and Vera farmed at Toolijooa which is down near Gerringong. He was one of five children, Daphne, Jack, Bruce, Ron with dad being the youngest.

Dad started school when he was six, this meant being doubled on the back of his brother Ron's bike for the first year of his schooling life. One of Dad's fond memories was of his father taking him to Toolijooa railway station where he had a brand new bike waiting for him.

He used to help with the every day chores on the farm including, feeding the calves before and after school and could remember his Father, Mother, Sister and Brothers hand milking all of the cows. When he was about 5 years old mechanical milking machines were purchased. He also remembered blocks of ice being delivered 3 times a week by the milk truck as well as the baker delivering bread twice a week.

Dad attended Nowra High School for 3 years, having to first ride his bike to Fields Farm and then catch O'Leary's bus to Nowra. During his high school years he played Rugby League, Cricket and participated in Athletics carnivals.

He left School when he was 15 years old and spent the next 3 years working on the Blow farm, at Foxground with Daphne and Doug.

When he was 16 he played in the Gerringong under 18's Rugby league team and they won the competition that year. One of the Gerringong players and good friend Alan Buckeridge came from Manly and this was how and why Dad came to barrack for and support the mighty Manly Sea Eagles.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> of March 1953 the family moved to Yellow Rock, Albion Park. He worked the farm with his Father and Mother as well as his brother Ron. In September that year Dad went to National Service for 3 months at Ingleburn. This was the first time he had ever been away from home. Not long after this Ron left the farm to start his own Welding business. Dad loved sport, played football for Albion Park First grade for 3 years and second grade cricket but gave up competitive sport once Ron left the farm.

At 19 Dad bought his first car, a brand new Austin A 30 from Wollongong. His pride and joy was used to travel to the many dances at Marshall Mount and Tullimbar and also the show balls and the pictures at Albion Park,

It was during this time he met a young blonde girl called Lexie. After a few years of courtship Dad finally plucked up the courage to ask mum to marry him. Dad thought he would ask Grandads permission for mums hand in marriage during a trip to the football in Sydney. Dad was so nervous he didn't ask until they finally pulled up in the driveway at home, perhaps thinking he might not have made it home otherwise.

Geoff and Lexie were married on the 14<sup>th</sup> of November 1959 in the Wesley Methodist Church, Crown St Wollongong.

After marrying in 1959 dad and mum went to live on the farm at Yellow Rock. At that time dad's parents moved into the Albion Park Township. We had a lot of great times on the farm along with a few hard years as well. In 1965 dad's father passed away in the middle of a crippling drought.

Dad and mum established the very successful Parkvale Ayshire Stud. This really became a major part of his life. Dad really loved his cows and was an innovator, using modern techniques such as embryo transfer and the best bulls from around the world through AI to improve his cattle. This produced a herd of cows that he was justifiably proud of and resulted in many show champions. When the farm was sold people often asked what he missed. Dad always replied "I don't miss the farm but I miss me cows"

In 1986 the Kiama Stud Registration Centre was formed. With four breed societies joining the Illawarra Cattle Society as Co-owners.

Dad became the Ayrshire director, serving as treasurer from 1986-1989 and also as President from 1989-1993

He recalled his time at the registration centre with great satisfaction, valuing the many happy times and memory's with his good mates and colleagues Ron Smith, Chris Foley and fellow directors.

Dad resigned as the Ayrshire representative in 1993 due to the fact he had retired from farming and thought it was best that an active farmer should be the Ayrshire representative.

Dad and mum built a wonderful life together, with her by his side as his partner and best friend. They enjoyed separate and shared interests and supported each other always.

Whatever Dad was involved in and wherever he was he seemed to make friends immediately and then keep them forever. This always meant a lot to dad and mum as well. Dad loved a good time and always enjoyed himself at dances, balls, parties and so on. Everybody knew his smile and his laugh. He always asked about what everybody was up to and really cared about the answer. Dad also loved helping young people be successful.

He was a strong leader and capable of making sometimes hard decisions, always listening to others views before forming his opinions. Dad being a dairy farmer was a hard worker, however rather than dwelling on how hard the work was, I always thought he used the milking time to think about what he could do to improve things in all aspects of his life.

We will always remember that he taught us to be tolerant of others. He was always the first person to offer help when needed. He was a loving Husband, Father, Father in Law, Granddad, Brother, Brother in Law, Uncle, Cousin, Colleague and Friend and would have done anything for his us and the grandkids.

I guess he was just there.

Reflecting on Dad's life, the hard work and his ethics, his love of life, achievements & success, along with the impact he had on all our lives made him a very special person.

From the eulogy given by Brett Hayter at Geoff Mayo's funeral.

Firstly I would like to say how honored and privileged I feel today to be asked to speak on behalf of the Ayrshire Breed and the Mayo family

Geoff's involvement with the Ayrshire Breed commenced with his father and a grad herd. In 1958 Geoff registered his first stud Ayrshire's. Geoff and Lexie were married the following year. Together they commenced showing their cattle at local shows.

They began showing at Sydney Royal in 1970 and they achieved their first Champion Cow in 1972 with Parkvale Diamond. From that time on Parkvale stud became predominant in the showing at Sydney Royal. In all from the mid seventies until the late 1980's the stud achieve twelve (12) Champion Cow awards plus numerous Heifer Championships. Geoff and Lexie and family had many successful years at Sydney Royal. In 1983 Bill Weir from Scotland donated a trophy after he had judged. It was awarded for the Pen of Three (3) Cows. The Parkvale stud won the award for the next five (5) years. In 1985 Geoff and his family won all the in milk classes at Sydney Royal. Perhaps their greatest achievement came in 1987 when Parkvale Star rose won her second Champion Cow award and went onto win Supreme Champion Dairy Cow. She was again Champion in 1988.

In 1989 Parkvale Kamay Bangle was the Supreme Champion Dairy Heifer. In all the time Geoff and his family were exhibiting at the Royal they were also supporting local shows, feature shows and of course Albion Park.

The milking herd was dispersed in July 1990 with a record achieved for an individual sale and a h herd average. The following two years the Champion Cow awards at Sydney Royal came from the sale. In 1992 the heifers were sold with an Australian record price set that still stands today.

Both Geoff and Lexie were awarded Life Membership of Ayrshire Australia.

Even though the stud was so successful Geoff's involvement with the breed was unselfish, he was always willing to help others.

He was a member of Federal Council for over 20 years attending countless meetings in all states. During this time he was NSW President and Federal President.

Geoff was a recognized judge of all breeds and judges at every Royal Show in Australia and in New Zealand. He also judged many country shows and All Breed classes.

Geoff and Lexie attended two World Ayrshire Conferences. In 1981 in New Zealand. In 1988 on the way to the conference in the USA, they visited the United Kingdom, Sweden and Canada.

Geoff was ever committed to the youth of our breed and all breeds. He was always involved with our judging schools and youth camps as an over judge and giving

advice. There would be many young people here today that were influenced and helped by Geoff.

Geoff was always interested in the future of the Ayrshire Breed and all other dairy breeds. He and Lexie had just returned from Canada where David was invited to judge in Quebec. I will personally miss Geoff very much as I looked upon him as my mentor.

Geoff will be sadly missed by Lexie and his family and of course all his friends, but he has left a legacy and a fine example to us all, always a gentleman.
