Any Place But Last.....Our Challenge!!!!

“Who’s in the SEMEX team miss?” “When will we find out who’s made the team?” “Am I clipping this year miss?” “Who’s judging this year? Who’s parading?” These are the questions that were asked many times during our after school Rural Youth sessions at the start of this year. Many hours were spent after school, parading and clipping cows and reading judging manuals in preparation for the 2013 Royal Easter Show’s SEMEX Youth Challenge. Hurlstone has competed in this challenge every year, finishing last for the first seven years. Last year, the team managed the great achievement of finishing **second** last and this was the standard we aimed to match this year... any place but last!

The Hurlstone Royal team was announced as well as the SEMEX team. The SEMEX team included a number of new students who had only joined the show team this year and had only attended a few local shows. Mrs Hackett had faith in the team – faith in us to not get last. Our new farm manager Leeanne put the parading team into “parading boot camp” the night before the competition... round and round the show ring they went, fine tuning their performance. The night before, Mrs Hackett had the clipping team practising by flood light... everyone knew their jobs. Any place but last! The first part of the challenge was fitting. Our team consisting of Jamie Whybrow, Sarah Ludington, Ethan Anderson and Ben Essam did an amazing job. They clipped the entire heifer, including the whole body, head, tail, feet and legs as well as topline it in only half an hour. This year there were no patches... and it was finished in time... Any place but last!

Another breeder commented on how he had seen the school start out in the competition as beginners and proceed to the point where they were turning out some of the best clipping jobs he had seen from the school, and in just half an hour. Jamie’s topline received many compliments... maybe we weren’t going to get last in clipping!



Next was the judging competition, which was a class of two year old milking Holsteins. David Webb, Matt Gregory and I were the judging team and as we handed in our decisions we felt we had done fairly well. David spoke confidently, and when the over judge announced his placings we felt confident that we had performed OK. ... maybe we weren't going to get last in judging.



Finally there was the parading competition and our very stylish team was Zoe Hall, Daniella Stewart and Polly Donoghoe who lead three equally stylish Ayrshire heifers confidently around the ring. At one point the judges switched our team with another group – was this to test out us or them? Maybe we had done OK in parading as well... maybe we weren't going to get last.



And then there was the presentation “sigh”... We were so nervous, and in fact there were screams from us when last place was announced and it wasn't us. And then more screams when we didn't come 7th ...or 6th ... or 5th ...

This went on for a while actually; until second place was announced. Screams quickly became shouts and shouts soon became echoes as they announced the champions of the Semex Dairy Youth Challenge for 2013 – Hurlstone Agricultural High School – sponsored by ABS.

We won! For the first time since the school started participating. We were given the champion vests reading “SEMEX Dairy Youth Challenge Champions 2013” which we put on and have worn with pride every possible moment since the Show... some day after we've grown a bit they may even fit!



After a few photos for some journalists and parents we headed back to the sheds screaming our heads off to share the news with the rest of our show team, who were as excited as us...until they had to catch the next bucket of poo and wash out the cows' topline...

Mrs Hackett phoned the school executive in the search of someone to tell of our achievement... dairy exhibitors from all over the state congratulated us on our win... but people who aren't involved in the dairy industry don't really get how big this achievement is. This week the school soccer team won the regional championships – other students and staff understand this... they don't really understand what it means to win the SEMEX challenge. Just as well we do – and we will forever wear those vests with pride!

Australia's Ayrshire Dairy Showcase

Australia's International Dairy Week has long been regarded as the most prestigious dairy cattle show in the Southern Hemisphere. The 2013 Ayrshire show was no exception. In January this year, the finest Ayrshire cattle from 4 states across Australia were on display at the Blackmore & Leslie Complex, Tatura, Victoria. With over 85 entries, judge Iwan Morgan from Wales was faced with tough decisions in awarding his class winners and ultimately his Champions.

Many animals compete at International Dairy Week before or after one of the many Royal Shows held in Australia. Our Junior and Intermediate Champions followed this tradition. The 2013 **Junior Champion** was **Woodburn Park Tirimasu**. Owned by AC & DE Biffin, from New South Wales and exhibited by their son & daughter Todd & Tammy, Tirimasu was an easy champion claimed Judge Morgan. Sired by Haresfoot Brazen out of Woodburn Park Trifle (Hunnington Mandella), Tirimasu was a standout in the Under 12 months' class. Following on with her winning ways from Dairy Week she competed at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in April. She was named Reserve Junior Ayrshire Champion, under judge Lisa Window-Walker from the UK.



The **Intermediate Champion** was a lovely 1st calf heifer from South Australia owned and exhibited by the Hentschke Family of Enterprise Ayrshires. **Enterprise Ristourn Aara** won the 2 years in milk class, before claiming the Champion title.



This stylish young heifer sired by Lagace Ristourn from Enterprise Iceman Aara, was also crowned Intermediate Champion at the 2012 Royal Melbourne Show. She is from the well known Aara family who produced the winner of the Popular vote in the Over 8 year old class in last year's World Ayrshire Federation Photo Competition.

In awarding his **Senior and Grand Champion** award, Iwan was particularly impressed with the correct rump structure and outstanding mammary system on his Aged Cow Class Winner. His selection was **Encore Pardner Didjago**. An eight year old Woodland View Pardner daughter of the 3 time Champion Cow – Neillunga Didjago. Owned by Lloyd & Linda Burgmann, Pardner Didjago was offered for sale and listed as Lot 1 in the Elite Ayrshire Sale following the completion of judging. She was highly sought after and sold to a syndicate for \$8,000.00.



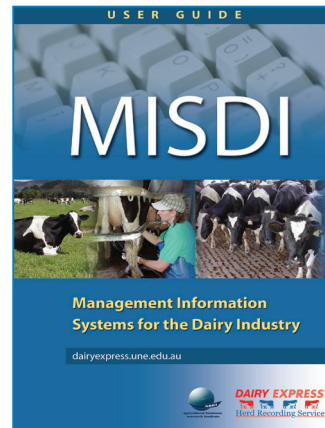

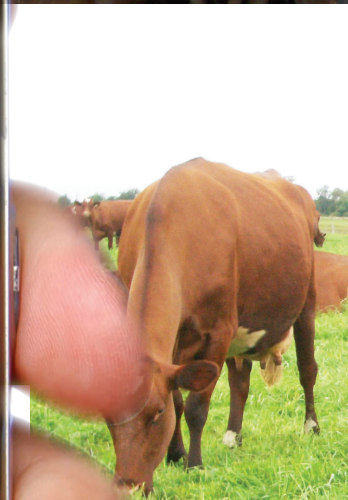
